Two items of news are particularly heartening and demonstrate how effective the efforts of HHI can be.


New Legs for Beulah. - Beulah was little girl of about five when we first saw her on our visit to the AKA school



for handicapped children in Tamil Nadu in 2016. She had deformed hands and no feet but was a lively little girl with a lovely smile and was a bundle of energy despite her infirmities. She touched our hearts when we saw her and following that visit were able to organise funding to pay for her to have artificial legs. She has now grown up to a lovely young teenager and, thanks to her prosthetic legs, is now able to attend a normal school. As she grows, replacement legs are necessary and she has just been provided with the latest set which will last her until she is about 18 years of age. HHI has again been able to pay the £1,500 needed for these. The photograph illustrates how well

Tom Sutherland's successor in Kerala caters for over thirty severely handicapped children and young adults who have to be taken to and from the school every day. The twice daily journey over the dreadful roads in the area takes a toll of the school's two vehicles and their replacement was becoming vital. Thanks to monies raised by SFHHI and contributed to by one or two generous donations from individuals and from the Round Strathaven 50 Committee we were able to contribute towards the cost of one bus and have paid the full cost of the other – a total of £11,000



**Tuition Groups** – Edmund was able to visit two of the Tuition Groups which are supported by the monies raised by Ian Gow from the Avondale Church Group and was pleased to see that the children had returned with their usual enthusiasm after the enforced shut down due to the Pandemic
